Bozay City Wis July 29th 1869

Dear Rodan

I rec^d the balance
due me on that debt yesterday
I return you my thanks for
the same - also enclose
your note -

Harvest has just commenced
here both in the openings &
the prairies

Times continue very dull here
money is scarce but we have
in hopes of better times in
a couple of months - which
will perhaps bring us out
of our troubles - hope so
at least

Wheat crop promises big at
present - it never looked better

Mary & Annie start this morning
for Oconomowoc (where Elder Whitman^{is})

to see about a school there
which is the work of Elder Whitman
Falls are all well - our little
Annie is living with Father & Mother
& is their delight - Carrie is
reading in the second reader
& progressing very rapidly (at home)
little David Wilburforce Snow is
taking his first lessons in
philosophy & arithmetic &c
Have you heard from John
lately? We have not.

I suppose you are all studying
nowadays but you must
be careful & not hurt your
health - I don't think there is
any danger though - unless there
has been a great change wrought
upon you (no offense meant)
I don't think I can say any-
thing more to your edification
or furtherance at present so,
