Dear Brother Daniel M. D.
Yours of Jan 30th arrived today
& I have an unexpected chance
of sending you a line over the snow.

I am very sorry that you have

need money. I was out on the plains
a few weeks ago & could have sent
you a hundred dollars & you would
have been welcome to it - as ever
you was to a glass of water when
thirsty but here I am in the mtns
without money & cannot get any.

I should think that I am might
spare you some, I sent him
\$350. a few months ago.

I can give you some next
fall & at any other time when I
have it. You need never be out of
money while I have any.

Do not be in too big a hurry to

graduate. You & all the other
Young Doctors of the day are half
crazy in your haste after the little
required quantum of knowledge required
to graduate as you call it.

I also rec'd another letter from
you a few days ago. Which I
will answer at length another time
I am now in great haste.

Always consider any money
that may be in my pocket - as
your own hereafter. John Price
