and now I must
conclude by telling you that
our faithful favorite, Nan -

years - is dead and buried
two weeks ago - I don't
know whether her place
can ever be filled -

Darling Dore

I received your
your very welcome letter of the 2nd
and am happy to know your
health is good - although you
are working hard, and studying
hard - Well Dore, I trust
you will not always be
climbing the hill difficultly -
but will soon be able to attain
to that position of usefulness
to which you aspire -
trials are often for the good of our
never dying souls - and we meet
with in every position of life
so let us look beyond the things
of time and space - to an
interceding Saviour, for solid
comfort - and we will not
be disappointed -

another year has passed away
and we are spurred to see another
of your birth-days - may that
blessing of the Lord that maketh
rich - and addeth no sorrow to
your portion - and may you
serve him all your days -

There has been several deaths
about here lately - a few
weeks ago Mr. Mahaffy and
Mr. McKaith met - and had
one of their long talks - when
Mr. Mahaffy took suddenly ill
and died the same week -
and Mr. McKaith took the
same disease on Monday last
week and was buried on
Saturday - and Mr. Mcervie
was buried last Sunday -
these are three of the old
settlers that came about
the time we did - this
seems like a loud call
for us to be ready -

we have been expecting Anna
home for a few days just - but
she has not arrived yet -
I am glad to have Joanna at
home - but she is rather
lonesome - she has received your
letter - she received a letter
from John yesterday - he is
quite well - and still
resides in the beautiful valley
how pleased I am to think
that the sun of happiness shines
upon him for the present -
I hope it will continue -
I have just been told that
Mary expects to be home in
a few weeks - we will be
glad to see her - she has
been absent about a year -
Margt. and Sarah and David
Mr. with all their families are
all well at present -
The weather here is
intensely hot - and has been
