We are all in our
usual health here

David's family are well
but very few in number

only Anne and Willie
being at home, but Carrie
is expected home in a
week or two from the North
where she has been teaching
for a year.

I expect all of
your family are attending
School now except one
perhaps.

Probably you know
that Annie's health has very
much improved during
her sojourn in Cal.
John has had a young
man with him all
Summer in training to
take care of the ranch.
He hopes to be more at
liberty very soon.

With kindest regards
to Emma yourself and
the children, I close
hoping you will let us
know if any hindrance
occurs at the time you
propose coming.
