I presume you have
wondered by this time
why I had not sent
that money. I could
have sent part of it
at any time but have
been quite disappointed
in getting the business
settled up with two of
those men to whom I sold

parties at a great distance
the business has moved very
slow but he thinks he can pay me

within a few days - but it

was a witness to one of the deeds
it was between good parties and
before one of our Notaries here
but we have been ascending here

get a new one and as the
parties are far apart it has
taken a good deal of time
but is perfectly safe and will
be all right very soon
if however the man gets tired
waiting and gives it up we will
make money by it as every thing
is still advancing finely
