Portage April 28th 1887

Dear Aunt

I gladly received your April letter - telling us you were all well and busy as ever - I hope you will succeed in having a pleasant and suitable home built that will give you all much satisfaction

Two weeks ago we moved into a smaller house on West Cook Street - I have only two rooms, but I like them much better than those I had before

We had fine weather for a week when we moved

- but since the weather
is cold with showers of
snow that soon melt)

We have not got any
nearer to either "Hirk or Market"
still I walked to Church last
Sabbath day.

David has this week
bought a very gentle horse
and a new carriage - I rode
in it yesterday for the first
time. His daughter Annie
and I rode up to 'Prospect
Hill' and many other places.

Mary painted a
picture of her baby when
she was seven months old
and sent it to me, in a
very handsome frame,
and now it hangs in
my parlor.

I am much pleased to
think that Emma and
the children will be able
to make us "Portage folks" a
visit this summer. I hope
nothing will occur to be
a hindrance to their coming.

Portage still grows
a good many new houses
will be built this summer.
