We have had a very
long severe winter, but
at last the snow has
disappeared

Mr & Mrs Goodyear
of our city has spent the
winter in California and
returned home a week
ago. I called on them

Yesterday and had a pleasant account of their travels. I had given them Johns address, and they found ^{him} in San Francisco where he is at present writing, and he wished them to go home with him but as they could not Annie came to San Francisco and met them there Annie gave them Joannes address and they made her quite a visit staying with her over night.

Perhaps you know that Walter Brown is in Europe at present on business he left New York about the middle of March

Our friends thought John looked very tired and weary, and they were told that he worked until very late at night. But they thought Annie looked as well as she had ever done, and she is thinking of coming home this summer. I hope she will be able to bear the severe winters.

They also thought Joanna looked very well she told them she expected to get to Portugal this summer.

I felt pleased to hear about those absent ones from them that had so recently seen them.
