Your letter of April 16th containing the prescription arrived safely it proved to be the very thing required, as the pain and disagreeable feeling has gradually ceased - except on my shoulder and that is still rubbed every night.

My general health is now as good as usual I now take long walks ~~as usual~~ or rides and enjoy them very much.

I thank you very much for both of the prescriptions you have sent me as they were just what was needed.

I had a letter from John last week he writes that he intended to make a trip to Wis - this summer but scarlet fever and other malades had cast back his work on the Ranch and also on the Book - for weeks the Publishers have been calling impatiently for copy, now he thinks he will not be able to leave home but will make an extra effort to

Leone and Annie
seems to enjoy living at
Loup City, they intend
making their home there
Mr Owen has bought
land there and will
build this summer

Mary has told us
that Annie intends to
be married next week
she hardly knows how
