Dear Daniel

Your kind letter

I am much pleased

name for him - I hope  
he will before very long  
I hope I shall yet have  
the pleasure of seeing  
him, as well as all of you

We have had a very  
mild pleasant winter

with very little snow  
or sleighing, but a great  
deal of sickness every where  
and our family have had  
a good share of it; but  
I am thankful to write  
we are all in our usual  
health again.

A letter from California  
tells us of the same sickness  
there but John and his  
family are all well again.  
He is again writing for  
the ~~Centenary~~ May magazine  
although his big book  
is not yet finished.

We were surprised  
to have a visit from  
John Reid. He looks well  
business brought him to  
Chicago and he came here  
only for a day or two —

Joanna has decided to stay  
in Partridge all of the  
summer as business still  
keeps Walter in Philadelphia.  
Her rooms with us being  
upstairs, did not suit  
her any longer as baby  
is now quite heavy so
