We have been out there for sometime attending the last days of my poor old father who died last week, or rather went to sleep quietly at the ripe old age of 91 years 7 mo³ & 28 days.

We are delighted to learn that you are coming east and both Fay & I want your wife and the girls to come and visit us while you are wandering in the woods, and you must be sure to bring them -

If the forests of Michigan or these central states will answer for the "Atlantic forests" I may go with you -

I am glad you liked the tobacco; fearing you might not like it, I only sent you half pound, but you must let me know when you are out & I will send you more.
