Albany, N.Y. Oct 17 1898

Dear Louisa. I'm on my way to Montreal by way of Lakes George & Champlain mostly to see the woods in their glorious Autumnal dress. I left Boston this morning & expect to be in Montreal tomorrow & return by the Lakes & the White Mountains. Expect to be in Boston again in about a week. Then spend a few days seeing people. Agassiz, Mrs Gray Wolcott Gibs, Bunnell & some of Pages friends. Then go to N.Y. & spend a few days then home, which way I don't yet know. I am now alone & feel pretty lonesome after such lively company in the South.

I meant to stop at N.Y. on way from Kentucky but was advised to go north sooner as possible to see the woods at their best. I spent a pleasant eventful day down the peninsula of Delaware & also had fine views of Virginia. I spent two nights at Canby's fine residence in Wilmington & would have seen more of Delaware had not Sargent been taken sick then & compelled to hurry home. Something like Grippe. I'm quite well. Have not had a single letter since leaving home. Expected a lot at Sargent's. Surely there must be some at N.Y. It seems years since this trip began. Love to all
