Alameda 4/ 1897-

Dear John.

I walked up three days ago with a clear brain surmounting my cervical pedicle. The old fellow had been meddling off in various directions for about three consecutive months without permission & I suppose he found no better quarters than those he was brought up in, ^{so} he concluded to return home. Its quite natural to see him, & as he gets pretty good treatment, he may remain a little longer into '86. Three months occlusion from the world is a pretty serious matter; & when you come to add it on to the jag end of life, its quite a serious abstraction from the little that is left.
