Seaside Oregon
Jan - 12 - 1903

My dear brother John

I received a
Telegram this morning from Mr
Stone the Baptist Minister saying
that sister Annie was "much improved
and in no immediate danger." it
was dated Jan. 14 - 5 - 7. She must
have been very seriously ill.

In my last letter from her dated
Dec 20 she said she would not be
able to go to Hiram's funeral as she
was recovering from a serious
illness and was not strong yet.

I said yesterday that I must write
her for I feared she must be sick
again as we had not heard from
her lately. You have likely heard
from her too. but I thought I

would let you know.

I will not write further just now as Mr Eastman is waiting to start for Scappoose, I had to get Anna to open my Telegram this morning, I did not know what to expect, it is so short a time since we received that sad, sad one from Chicago. Anna is pretty well again but Ah! so lonely.
