Letter from Wanda [Muir] to [John Muir], [1903] Sep 19.

I wonder where you are and
what you are doing this evening.
It does seem so strange to
be sending a letter to you
to China but I hope it will
reach you sooner than the
ones we sent to Russia. I
can't understand at all why
you didn't hear from us for
such a dreadfully long time
for Helen and I have written

[17] Sept 1900

Dear Papa

I enclose a letter
from Mr Secor to you, the
spoons and photograph which
he speaks of reached Marting
safely and they are beauties
but wasn't it a strange
idea for him to send them.
I wrote and thanked him for
them and told him where you
were.

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after, ever since we got back
from the mountains. It seems
a very long time ago since
you left home but from
your letters you must be
having a fine time and
seeing many wonderful
things. I wish I were with
you.

Everything is about as usual
both here in Berkeley
and at home. Mame is pretty
well most of the time and Helen
enjoys her school work much
more this term than she did
last and is very well and
happy. Aunt Margaret is
not at all well but is a little
stronger than she was last
month.

It is very late so I must
stop now but I will write
a longer letter tomorrow.
