Dear Brother John

This has been a sad home-coming for you all, and still Lorie is very ill. I did not know that she was worse than usual <sup>until</sup> Maggie's letters came, written on the 26 and 27<sup>th</sup> June. The last one the fluid had been drawn from her lungs giving her relief. We have had nothing later until yesterday and kept hoping that she was still keeping better. Did the letter to Miss Thayer Ede says the case is still very serious. How hard it must be for you all. I sympathize with you all in your anxiety and will hope that still may be a change for the better.

Give my love to Grandpa and Helen. What a blessed comfort it will be to their Mother to have you all back and about her.
