There have been a good many tourists and the Stevensons are feeling prosperous enough so that they have just invested in a camera for Virginia, and are talking about planting a lawn, though as yet there are the usual tin cans and the grubbs much the same.

I enclose a letter from the Santa Fe people who want to know about the Blue Forest. You better let them know as soon as possible for the more tourists the better we fare and the better it is for everyone. Write and let us know what you are doing and how everything is in the
