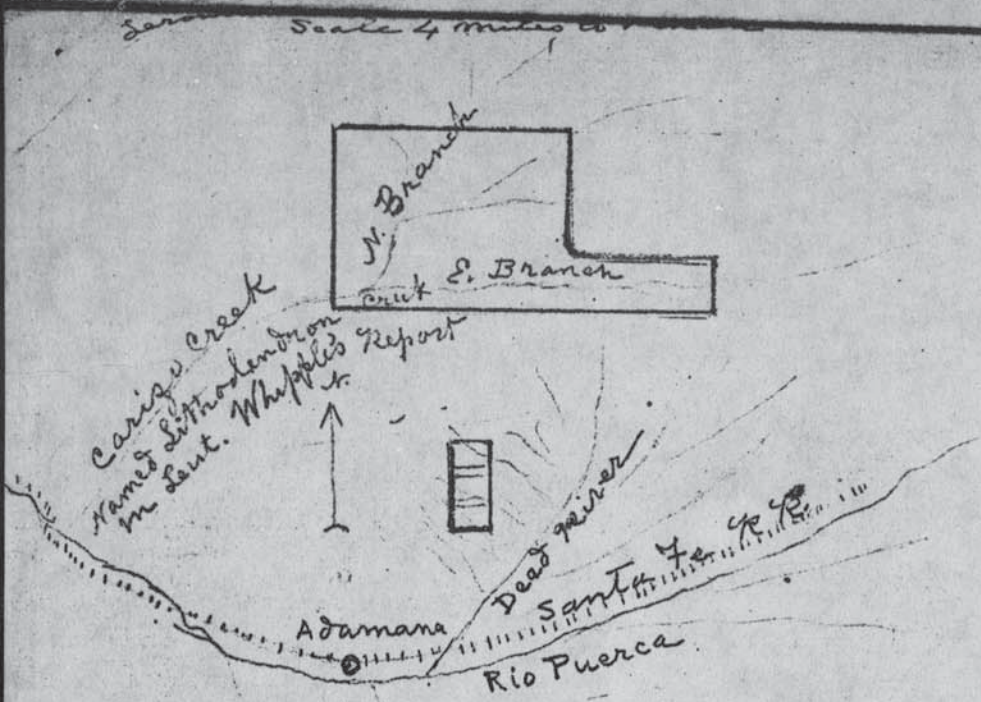

 Dear Mr Bond:

I don't see how I will be able to describe the boundaries of the petrified forest remains north of Adamana even on the Santa Fe Co's maps without going over the ground with a surveyor.

But after camping 17 days
in the North Forest & examining
it carefully I feel sure that
excepting only a few scattered
outlying trunks it may all be
comprehended in an area of
about two thirds of one township.
While the three small patches
on the West side of the basin of Dead
River cover only about 2 sections
or about 25 sections in all. as
shown on the above sketch map.

Monuments of the world's old
forests I am
