Dear Mr Keeler:

As no doubt you have seen by the newspapers, Mr Phelan & the S. F. Supervisors are trying to get the use of Hetch Hetchy Valley for a reservoir for city water supply. Their application to the Secretary should be denied because Hetch Hetchy is a wonderful counterpart of Yosemite with the same grand walls similar in form & sculpture, with falls gardens groves meadows etc. To dam it would be as destructive & deplorable in its effects on the Park as damming Yosemite itself. For not only would it be rendered utterly inaccessible but the way up the Canyon of the Park to the grand Central Camp ground of the volume would be blocked.
