Your letter of the 6th inst,

today. We are so sorry to learn that

Mrs Sellers & I have been and are still
very busy with a gang of carpenters, painters
& decorators on the house, trying to do as
little as possible (as we are very anxious to get
in the house) but still doing a great deal.
We found it necessary to have one thing led to
another - Mrs Sellers is pretty well and
I am very much better than I was when
I wrote you last. I have just returned from
the house where I have been all day & am
very tired. Our goods are somewhere on the
road & if they get here this month will be thank-
ful.
