Dear Mr Muir-

We were greatly shocked

at what you wrote about poor Helen.

The desert is an interesting place to visit but to <sup>be</sup> banished there for two years seems very hard. I did not answer your letter because I was trying to find some one who had acquaintances at Mohave, Barstow or some other "eating house town" on the desert, but so far have not succeeded. I met Lukens the day he recommended your going to a ranch near Daguerre, but I thought it would be better to get ~~not~~ some town where there was a barony eating house so you could get eastern beef.

Neither he or I know whether you ~~can~~ started yet or not, but hope daily to hear from you.

We are not in our house yet & it looks as tho' it would be at least 2 weeks more before we get there. It seems an interminable job to get it ready. Our goods & servants are all here. Do let us hear from you when you get located. Mrs Sellers joins me in love & respect for you both
