Dear Sir:-

Will you kindly AID us in preparing a complete and accurate biography, of about one thousand words, BY SENDING a full account of your life and work, making brief mention of your family history; or by INDICATING THE SOURCES from which such authentic data may be obtained; or by expressing a willingness to be interviewed regarding the insertion of such a sketch in our great National Biography.
