My dear brother John:

I fell and broke my wrist two months ago there was also an artery broken. I manage to do things now by being careful, it being my right hand letter writing is one of the things I cannot do easily.

May said that Helen and her husband was in the Valley. I hope they will visit us here before they return to their home. Etta is not at all strong and has to be careful about what she does. Kenneth will soon be home from school during vacation he will work in the same place as last year.

The postman has just handed me a letter from Joanna written from Lincoln.
