Dear Mr. Colby:-


Hope you had a fine time. I have been hard at work down here on another book and have made pretty fair progress.

I enclose a letter from President Ripley of the Santa Fe on the subject of a trolley along the rim of the Grand Canyon. I think with him that we should use our influence against the granting of permission by the government for such a scheme, as it might be the beginning of a series of schemes that we would have to fight in other national parks.
