

Dear Dr. Bade:

I have yours of June 29, and reply at once. I will be in Harrisburg, as I now expect, on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, July 2, 3 and 4. Not later than Wednesday of the following week I expect to leave for my summer home at Eagles Mere, and it is now probable that I will have to spend Monday, the 13th, if not Tuesday, the 14th, in New York. I will make every effort to be home on the 14th, and it would be a great pleasure to see you at any time.

I think a concerted effort to upset the San Francisco Hetch-Hetchy ignominy will at least call national attention to the wrong, and since I wrote you before, much progress has been made toward securing a union of forces among various associations which could be expected to do something in this respect.
