Dear Papa -

We received the two crates of fine grapes all right and have been feasting ever since. As Mr Van Dyke is still in Los Angeles I gave the grapes to Dick. The Agent here said fifty cents was the right price, that a mistake had been made in charging me eighty-five, and he would pay me the difference.
