My dear Mr Muir

Your note of the 13th inst enclosing the "James letter," which I herewith return to you, came duly to hand.

I showed the "James" letter to Worman & left with him, to consider more at his leisure, a copy thereof. In talking with him of how James quoted over you, ^{in that letter,} we both decided that it was best, at present, to work on him on that line.
