My dear Mr. Muir -

My hospital work
being at last finished, I came
back to Los Angeles yesterday to
find our poor mother was
behaving - Her indisposition
will only keep her in bed a
few days longer, I think, and
then we may start northward -
Your letter to her came this
morning - I wish we might
hear of you rested and feeling
well before you start off on
your travels - Maybe the
steamer trip will be in
itself a rest and pleasure
to you - You ought to be
a good sailor - if experience

hardens me in that line -
I hope that your trip
will be one of much pleasure
to you throughout, and
we look forward to hearing
of it from you in person
on your return.

Ellie and Maude have just
come back from their trip
to Tahiti - both full of
interest - Ellie looking well,
Maude thinner from her
continued sea-sickness
but improving since her
landing - They are still
in the region of San
Francisco - My Uncle
Osgood and his wife are

bullied into a trip to
Yosemite this summer -
He regretfully turned his
face from his era-adored
Tahoe - and faced the
scouring trip into the
valley nobly - to be as
completely won over to the
wonderful country as
hearts could wish - He
proposes camping trips
there next summer -

My future lies immediately
(as mother has told you) in
work at another hospital by
the end of this year - and

after that, is indefinite -
 but whatever I do begins
 first and foremost on the
 fact that she and I are
 not to be separated - Europe
 or medicine or civic
 work or a laboratory, she
 is to be lady patron while
 I oil the wheels!
