Dear Mr Muir:- Early in Feb.

& letters of the 71 members of
the American Academy of Arts
& Letters. We have an excellent
full page portrait of you and

are very much in need of a few
lines from you, to mount with
it in this Literary set.

Will you kindly allow us to
have just a few lines from you
in reply to this - to place
opposite your portrait in the
volume. The subject matter
is not important, only a
greeting of half a dozen lines
will be of great value to us.
Almost all these little letters
are one-page - octavo - (to face the
portraits;) & the only essential
is that they be your own writing
& not type-written - May we
beg of you just a few lines
& we will be under obligations.
