Dear Sargent:

I'm very glad you are so hopefully recovering from your dangerous crushing accident.

I made a lot of pencil sketches of *Stranearia brasiliensis*, but got no good photographs. I hope to get some however; for several of the mill workmen in the Parana forests promised to send me as many as I liked as soon as they obtain a supply of films.

I brought home flowers & young cones, but none mature as it was in mid October when I was in the woods. Perhaps I can get some of workman to carefully wire & pack a boxful. If successful I'll divide with you.

I had a glorious trip both in S. America & Africa. Notes of which I hope to write soon & will send copy.
