Dear Miss Kellogg:

I'm very glad to get your letter & the picture of the fine Muir Lodge. Send one of the school.

It's pleasant to be remembered in this way in the midst of this long drawn out battle for our National parks.

I've done no other work since the present fight began - over three months. A letter from Mrs Kellogg told your journey east. Glad you are again at work on your book. I hope to see it before it goes to press. I never saw any M.S. so fine as yours.

I was scrambling ahead among my Alaska notes when those

Hatch Hitchy politicians stopped  
everything. Their robber Raker  
bill will come up the senate  
for final action not later  
than December 6<sup>th</sup>. and in the  
meantime we must fight  
hard to raise a storm of  
public opinion to defeat it.  
hoping President Wilson will  
veto it. and of course you

as possible to help, sending  
protests to senators & President  
in flocks thick as winter  
snowflakes. We are getting  
lots of new circulars & pamphlets  
printed some of which I'll  
send you. In the meantime
