But I appreciate your wish to see me.

We are laying out some important activities for the Academy. It was a great occasion when Brieux in the official costume of the French Academy presented its greetings and good will. We have received the \$100,000 of bonds and shall receive the four city lots within a fortnight. Altogether 1914 has been a great year for the Academy.

We are soon going to begin collecting memorabilia about the members for the archives. What have you concerning yourself, in the way of portraits, manuscripts, published volumes, etc., etc. that you will contribute to these archives? <u>Put on your thinking cap</u>. Have you your first record of the discovery of the Huir Glacier?
