Dear Mrs Muir,

We arrived safely home  
Tues. P.M. very tired but thankful to be  
under the shadow of the pines once more.  
Mr Cucher is quite ill with a cold, and  
I am not much better. Celia had entertained  
as many as ten guests at one time while  
we were away, so you may believe she  
has not been idle. We are now taking  
care of a very sick man who has been  
threatened with Pneumonia.

We have engaged  
seven horses to be here on the 19<sup>th</sup> for  
your daughters and their friends. I can  
get a reliable guide and packer (the owner  
of the horses) to accompany the party at three  
dollars per day he charges two dollars for  
his services per day and one for the horse he will  
ride. he expects one dollar per day for each
