From all the recent reports that I get from the rebellion in Honolulu I am inclined to think we had better give up or at least postpone the proposed trip to that place. What do you think about it? I have just talked with a gentleman who has returned from there on the last steamer & he thinks the trouble, instead of being over, has but just begun. I would like to see

the Islands but dont care
to go there when everything is
so unsettled. How do you
feel about it? And how is
your work coming on?

My head has troubled me
very much of late and I
fear I shall not return to
Chicago as early as I had
thought and consequently shall
not return to San Francisco
for a couple of months yet;
presume we will find much
better weather there anyway -
The weather here is delightful
bright warm sunshiny every
day and vegetation so fresh &
beautiful - Why cant you
bring Mrs Muir - Grandma &
the children down here for
a few weeks it would do
them all good & afford us great
pleasure - Say joins me
in kindest regards to you all
