My dear Mr Sellers.

I expect to finish the first article tomorrow. Then comes three more & a book. Still after I have done enough to honestly earn a rest I shall be only too glad to go there with you to see the palms & ferns & that famous old fire place of nature.

The weather here is now delightful. Sunshine & clear song in abundance. Mrs Strutzel is too much an invalid to travel & Mrs M. Cant leave her but Pasadena trip would



be delightful. I have not been  
in San Francisco since I saw you  
nor have I heard from the artist.  
Therefore he must be well &  
money-busy. Remember me to  
Frank when you write, cordial  
regards to Mrs Sellers. Tell her  
that Mrs Stentzel & Mrs M. want  
a better photo of her. They say the  
one I brought home is not nearly  
good enough. And don't forget  
your own as you promised, &  
in all your plans be sure you  
give ample scope for your visit  
to us. I've been pecking away at  
my Alaska until I can't sleep.
