I am just starting for  
China — and wish very much you were  
going with me — you ought to have been ready

beautiful places. Don't forget me as I never  
shall you. China will my address for the next  
three months. Prential Bank Hong Kong  
write to me there — the daughter of Ah Mah nee  
will be in print in the fall how you will  
laugh when you see it — You and Cosie are  
the last survivors except the ever loving hills

with you know them all people do write to the  
address and I will write to her Carr —  
Keep to your good old life — Nature is the best  
friend — the happiness of fortune is a feeble  
It is blowing great Gales and I hence to  
start to night — I think of me tossing on  
a little shooner on the west ocean with no  
one but a Dutch Captain to speak to — but  
I shall see the Sandwich Islands and that  
will be cheering yours ever sincerely
